

PAPER WRITING RULES

Text must be prepared using Microsoft Word (MS Office 2003-2007).

Word files should be A4 in size, prepared using the Times New Roman font, with a maximum of 15 pages.

Shapes (graphics, maps, photos) must be at least 300 DPI resolutions in JPEG or TIFF format. Shapes should not be included in the text file but should have subtitle (description).

WRITING RULES:

PAPER HEAD (CAPS, TNR 14pt, dark)

1 Line Space (12pt)

Author / Author's Name and LAST NAME (TNR 12)

1 Line Space (12pt)

Abstracts (TNR 12pt, Dark)

Abstracts should not exceed 250 words. Abstract Text must be TNR 11pt, side-aligned, and italic.

Keywords: (TNR 11pt, dark): (3-5 pieces) Keyword1, Keyword2, Keyword3, Keyword4, Keyword5 (TNR 11pt, normal)

TEXT

Text; Input, Field of Study, Material and Method, Findings and Discussion, Results, Contribution and Bibliography sections should be formed. Subheadings should be Times New Roman 12pt, Dark. Main Text: Times New Roman 12pt, should be written normally.

Shapes (graphics, maps, photos, etc.) It should be at least 300 DPI resolution in JPEG or TIFF format and should be arranged in accordance with A4 page size.

Figure and table descriptions must be TNR 11pt.

Shapes should not be contained in the text file, they should have subtitle (description).

POSTER PRESENTATIONS

Poster presentations will be held during the symposium and the authors must be at the beginning of their posters during the time their posters are hanging in advance in such a way that they can provide information and answer questions. The poster size should be no more than 90cm (en) x 90cm (height). Poster text should be read from 1-2 meters.

ABSTRACT REVIEW PROCESS

Participants whose abstracts are accepted at the end of the peer review process are notified by email. Abstracts that are not considered suitable for the presentation of the paper may be proposed to be presented as posters. Applications that prefer to present posters instead of presentations should mention this in the email.

ORAL PRESENTATION RULES

Presentations will be made by the responsible author specified in the abstract.

Studies that are not presented will not be included in the symposium abstract booklet.

Researchers will be given 10 minutes of presentation and 5 minutes of discussion.

Presentations will be held in one of the Congress languages. After the purpose, material and method are mentioned quickly in the presentations, findings, conclusions and discussions should be mentioned in a significant part of the presentation.

Oral presentation should not be complicated but should also be supported with visual elements. Presentations will be made in accordance with the congress schedule and no changes will be made.

Vehicles and equipment such as projectors, computers, etc. will be available in the halls.

A digital copy of the presentation files should be kept in flash memory and your e-mail addresses, the presentation should be uploaded to the computer at the beginning of the session and checked that it works.
